WHAT

Judy is a gorilla who is coming all the way from California by plane. She will arrive here tomorrow to join the new exhibit at the Sun Valley Zoo.

WHO

Judy is a 3 year old female gorilla who was born at the zoo in California. She is five feet two inches and weighs 369 pounds. "In spite of her ferocious roar," says zookeeper James Taylor, "Judy is really a very gentle ape."

WHY

The Sun Valley Zoo has been developing a new exhibit for apes. New areas have been made for the chimpanzees and orangutans, as well as for Judy. The exhibit is made to look as much as possible like the animals' natural habitat.

WHEN

The new exhibit will be open to the public next Monday. The zoo has spent over a year constructing this site. The animals will be moved into their new area today and tomorrow and given a week to adjust to their new home.
